#### **Committee Meeting 21 June**

Mostly a raft of routine monthly business matters and reports, with some main points summarised as follows:

- *Volunteers:* Once again the important role of our Club volunteers was acknowledged, including those giving up their time to participate in Tuesday course working bees.
  - Particular concern was raised about the apparent growing reluctance of members on Saturday Club days to help with bar duty: if say four members could manage an hour's bar duty each after their games, or two players two hours' duty each, then we would be able to cover the period from 12.30-4.30pm without needing anyone to do the whole four hours on their own. Several bar duty options were discussed (including bringing back the roster if we could get more volunteers) but further consideration is required.

The suggestion was made and agreed that perhaps more members would be willing to help on some of the smaller general tasks in the Club if there was a list of those tasks put up on the clubhouse noticeboard which members could put their names to - to be actioned.

- Three new remote-locking sectional doors are to be installed on the greenkeeper's shed to replace the current faulty doors and assist course personnel in coming and going while staying on their tractors and leaving the shed secure when they are out on the course.
- Traffic light system on 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> tees: An orange/amber caution sign instead of red is being trialled to raise awareness whilst not actually stopping play from the 3<sup>rd</sup> tee. It was noted that this is really only an issue when play is from the Blue tees.
- Seating and benches around the course are to be repositioned.

## Golfing Tips

**SAVING SHOTS in SAND** is practicing a method of standing to the ball & having a "V" swing. Firstly you adopt an open stance that is when your toe line is aiming well left of your target, (for right handers) & wriggle your feet into the sand to give yourself a secure stance. Secondly with the ball opposite your front foot aim the club face to the target with your hands behind the ball. From here pick the club up with your wrists on a much steeper swing path than normal **more or less on** 

the line of your toes. This gives you half the "V." Keeping your HEAD VERY STEADY pull the sand wedge into the sand about 3-4" behind the ball & follow through the sand completing the "V" swing & stay flat footed. The ball will come out on a cushion of sand hopefully floating towards the pin. The swing is full & smooth, never short or jerky. To hit the ball further you move the ball a little back in your stance thus taking less sand between the ball & the club face & achieving more power.

So practice the basics in sand to SAVE SHOTS. Good Luck & Happy Golfing. Your Personal Pro John

The New World Match Play Champs start next week with the top 16 qualifiers.


The competition is **Best Nett on the Hole**. Please see the draw in this week's


newsletter and also on the club board. The **following week the Flights (8 players)**

The Eagles Society has been going for 50 years and has raised over 5 million going towards junior golf and the Halberg Disability foundation.


