Dogs on Course

At the committee meeting on 19 February, the issue of dogs on our course and unbagged dog excrement being put in on-course rubbish bins was discussed. Apart from being very unpleasant, this was deemed to be an unacceptable health hazard for those emptying the bins – and a very poor look for our Club when third parties using our course for tournaments are cleaning up and emptying bins around the course after their golf. In fact bagged or unbagged, holding this material in our rubbish bins at all is not acceptable.

Further, there have been occasions when reasonably big dogs have been seen running more or less uncontrolled while their owners hit a few golf balls, and for some of our members an unleashed dog running around presents a threat to them.

It is a real pity for responsible dog owners that others have let their team down by not managing their dogs adequately and not taking dog excrement with them when they leave the course.

As a result, the committee resolved on 19 February to ban dogs from the course with immediate effect, and appropriate signage is now in place on the clubhouse beside the sliding entrance doors and at the golf cart entrance.
