From the President's Pen

Update on Projects

Despite the Covid-19 pandemic stresses, strains and Alert Level lockdowns this year, your committee has been progressing and planning several projects:

- **Bunker refurbishments:** New sand and drainage improvements have been actioned on several bunkers. The face of the front bunker on the 10th hole is being targeted for improvement too as an effective bunker apparently should provide an average player with a fair chance of getting out in one shot! A proposal floated to add fairway bunkers to the 12th and 18th holes, and possibly some pot bunkers around the 18th green, "lies on the table" for the time being whilst reactions of members are assessed (so far it seems that "par" golfers generally want the additions while "bogey" golfers generally do not!)
- New hole signage: Thanks to Paul Rauputu for proposing and John Rayner for leading this project, with 23 smart new hole signs about to be installed in the tee areas.
- Shelter by 1st tee: Longstanding member Kath Alvis has generously offered to sponsor this project, for which we have an ex-NPDC bus shelter waiting to be refurbished and installed.
- Amenities block upgrade: Items of bathroom equipment have been quietly sourced by John Rayner during the year as we work towards overdue upgrades of the men's and women's facilities, but the date for starting onsite work remains uncertain.
- Carpark sealing: The committee has been obtaining quotes for sealing our carpark, a project that would really enhance the entrance to our Club. The cost for installing a chipseal surface as well as providing for adequate drainage is likely to be about \$80,000 clearly a major investment for the Club and one which will not be taken lightly. Various funding initiatives will need due consideration before any green light is given to this project.
- Other: There are always several other smaller improvement projects on the go around the clubhouse and course at any time, including more planting out on the banks around the water storage reservoir any spare plants would be welcome!

Points awarded based on where golfers finish in relation to other trialists only.*

Where; Westown Golf Club, 964 Mangorei Rd, New Plymouth


Cost; First week is FREE! (other weeks \$5)
