New World Wednesday Report

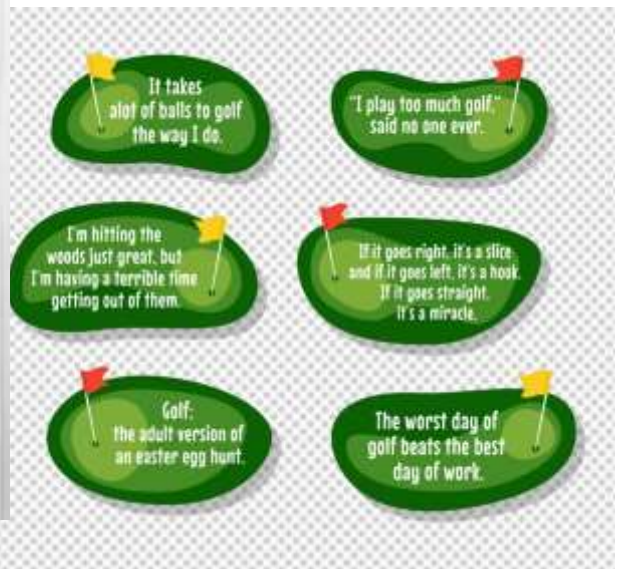

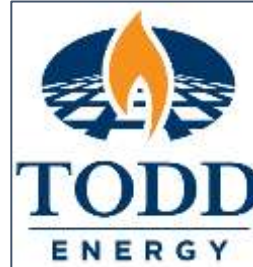
Greenkeeper Stratty Report
