Please keep the play moving smoothly by keeping up with the group in front of you.


Just a couple tips how this can be achieved.

Golf too easy? Try playing expert level.



Strokeplay

- To be played on designated dates RD1 3/5/2025, RD2 10/05/2025, Spare day if RD 1 or 2 not played 17/05/2025, RD3 24/05/2025, RD4 7/06/2025 (last round maybe seeded to be confirmed)
- Divisions Senior + to 9, Intermediate 10 to 16, Junior 17 to 24, Limit 25 + handicaps have been frozen during the four rounds
- All rounds played off Blue Tee's
- > All four rounds to be played to qualify for Strokeplay Champ (gross)
- All holes to be completed if not hole to be entered as PICK UP do not enter adjusted score for the hole (incorrect scoring will result in DQ)
- Playing groups are to be no less than three and no more than four match committee approval required if different before playing starts
- > All cards to be signed by player and marker with markers name clear and legible
- > If in doubt of ball been OB reload naming provisional to keep play moving
- No slow play, keep the group in front within sight. Two shot penalty per player per group may apply if slow play proven
- Minimum of four Match Committee Members will make any decisions required includes rulings, playable or unplayable with advice from Course Convenor and/or Superintendent
- > Most importantly enjoy your golf on a gem of a course we have.

Matchplay

- Qualifying for Matchplay is best 3 of the 4 rounds of Strokeplay, Top 16 in each division to play for Matchplay Champion
- If unable to play any of these dates DO NOT ENTER Matchplay 21/06/2025 (top 16), 5/07/2025 (quarter finals), 12/07/2025 (semi-finals) 2/08/2025 finals day as all finals played on the day with 3/08/2025 booked as spare day in case of unplayable.
- Please advise Club or Vice-Captain John Skellern / Robert Butler if not playing in Matchplay during the Strokeplay rounds
- Matchplay rounds are to be played on or before the designated dates (not after) excluding finals day which is on the day (2/08/2025) not negotiable.
- All matches played off Blue tee's
- Off the stick Gross per hole
- All golf rules apply
