Covid Policy Update

With the country having now moved to the **Covid Protection Framework Orange traffic light** setting, Golf NZ has provided the updated guidelines below, which our Club will follow:

- There is no requirement to scan in via the displayed QR code poster or to have mandatory sign-in record keeping.
- There are no capacity limits for golf activities in indoor or outdoor settings.
- Customers in golf hospitality venues do not need to wear a face mask and do not need to be seated to be served.
- Customer-facing workers in indoor golf hospitality venues must wear a face mask.
- There are no limits on the number of people who can be at indoor or outdoor golf hospitality venues.

Just a reminder that with the Omicron Covid-19 variant still prevalent in the Taranaki community, please stay away if you are feeling unwell at all. Also, if you contract Covid-19, it is a self-management situation with home isolation for seven days required before you will be able to rejoin the outside world.

Points of note are summarised as follows:

- Covid-19 Policy: Discussions about the ever-changing rules landscape (see above).
- A box of 520 Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) has been provided by Tui Ora for distribution to members (available in clubhouse just ask).
- Membership: The Club now has a total of 246 members, comprised mainly of 179 full playing men, 31 full playing women and 17 nine hole players.
- Carpark upgrade project: The committee continues to explore possible affordable options to upgrade our carpark this year, but this is proving very challenging in the current economic climate.
- Amenities upgrade project: Very good progress has been made on upgrading the men's amenities, thanks in particular to the great efforts of members John Rayner, Richard Hamel, Malcolm Elder, Kevin Mancer, Gary Pigott and Les Wildman.
- Caterer: We are very pleased to have appointed Rochelle Coleman as the Club's new caterer. Rochelle has made very positive first impressions in the role.
- New dishwasher purchased and installed in kitchen, funded by a members generous donation.
- Greenkeeper Karl Stratton has communicated to the committee further proposals for course improvement.
- A significant amount of fallen tree removal and tree maintenance work has been carried out around the course by our hardy band of volunteers thank you all.
- Bar manager Marie Rayner would appreciate hearing from additional volunteers willing to do a few hours of bar duty every so often.
- Dot Golf online tee time booking system: This innovation for our members seems to be working well thanks to Ian Titter and Martin Nobbs.

- Following feedback from members, the Match Committee is reviewing the formats of the Club Championships and other competitions such as the Foreman Trophy with a view to making improvements next year.

- Various course beautification activities by volunteers ongoing in low key fashion – noted and appreciated by committee.

- Reciprocal rights agreement now in place with Manor Park Golf Club in Lower Hutt.



Greg Norman Golfing Tips


The Short Thumb

Proper grip pressure is one of golf's most elusive fundamentals - and it's as difficult to describe as it is to achieve. One method that has helped me set the proper pressure in my left hand is the 'short-thumb' technique.

Take your usual grip on the club, with your left thumb extended straight down the shaft. Now, slide the thumb upward, about a centimetre. Notice the effect this has on the tightness of the hold in the last two fingers of your hand. This is exactly where you want a firm, secure grip.

This is one key that I check all the time. If you occasionally experience a looseness in your swing - or the inaccuracy it causes - I recommend that you too experiment with the short thumb.


