







Club President Report

Carpark Upgrade & Sealing Project: Unfortunately I have to advise that this project will not now proceed as planned at end November. At an extremely late stage the contractor invoked two of its conditions of quotation, the first being the right to charge its client any increased materials, labour, freight and overhead costs which may arise after the date of quotation, and the second being the recently reassessed need to bring in a significant quantity of additional clean aggregate to act as a sub-base for the chip seal finish (current sub-base now deemed largely unsuitable). The result was a massive increase of over 150% in total cost, which not surprisingly took the project using that contractor well beyond the bounds of the specific budget the Club had set aside. The committee will

now explore other options for upgrading the carpark and improving its surface.

Pine Tree Working Bee: Many thanks to the keen band of volunteers who have assisted over the last few days in clearing the extensive amount of timber debris resulting from the felling of the tall pine tree on the dogleg corner of the 2nd fairway. The tree lost a major high branch last week and was deemed unsafe to be left standing, and a tree-felling contractor was called in to undertake the job. See the accompanying picture from yesterday afternoon as the remainder of the debris was being cleared away by our volunteers.








Golfing Tips





Rules corner: On the putting green

I had a question asked on Saturday while at the club. A player asked what relief was available when an old hole was in the way when putting. Can I drop away from the old hole?

The answer can be found in **Rule #13c "Improvements allowed on the putting** green"

Whether your ball is on or off the green, you may without penalty

- 1. Remove Sand and Loose Soil on the putting green.
- 2. Repair damage on the putting green. This may be done by using your hand, foot, or other part of the body or a normal ball-mark repair tool, tee, club or similar

"Damage on the putting green" means any damage caused by a person or outside influence, such as Ball marks, shoe damage (spike marks) and scrapes or indentations caused by equipment or a flagstick, **Old hole plugs**, turf plugs, seams of cut turf and scrapes or indentations from maintenance tools or vehicles,

"Damage on the putting green" does not include:

- 1. Normal practices for maintaining the overall condition of the putting green (such as aeration holes and grooves from vertical mowing),
- 2. Irrigation or rain or other natural forces
- 3. Natural surface imperfections such as weeds or areas of bare, diseased, or uneven growth. These may be covered by a local rule if required
- 4. Natural wear of the hole.

Long story short, if an old hole plug is on your line of putt you can

- 1. Play the ball as it lies
- 2. repair the old hole
- 3. take an unplayable ball option, taking a one stroke penalty to move your ball so the hole is no longer in your line of play
- 4. swear uncontrollably at the green keeper who will tell you politely to go away and enjoy your game. He may even give you a tip on how to repair holes in the green including pitch marks
