

Golfing Tips RULES.

The one thing that every golfer should have in his golf bag is a Rule Book. You can pick one up free in the Clubhouse. Most years there are additions & changes so it would be wise to acquaint yourself to the basic rules at least:

- 1. Out of Bounds.
- Lost Ball.
- Water & Lateral Hazards.
- 4. Ground Under Repair (GUR).
- 5. Unplayable Ball.

My advice would be simply to read about Etiquette on pages 18 – 21 & The Definitions pages 22 – 35. These cover most of the vital information that you'll require on a round to round basis. But, if in doubt rather than hold up play, put a 2ND ball in play (a provisional ball). Play out both balls & get a ruling when you get in the Clubhouse. You'll be surprised how many people are willing to give you the benefit of their experience &

how many variations to the rule there are!

Get yourself a RULE BOOK.
