Annual General Meeting

The 119th Annual General Meeting of the Club was held on Monday evening. Apart from annual reports presented by officeholders, main points are as follows:

- **Elections**

Congratulations to all who were elected and we look forward to a successful 2023.

- **Finances**

The Club's finances continue to be in good heart, with net profit of \$35,000 for the financial year ending 30 September, similar to the previous year when the one-off Toi Foundation grant of \$37,650 (for the carpark upgrade) and Greymouth Petroleum's donation of \$30,000 (for a future water bore) are taken into account.

- **Subscriptions**

As indicated previously, the Club is experiencing increased costs across its operations in this higher inflation economic climate, in particular for fuel, fertiliser, sprays, grass seed, electricity and equipment maintenance. Following discussion, the following motion was approved at the AGM:

"That annual subscriptions for 2023 be increased from 2022 levels by 7% (to the nearest \$5) in all subscription categories except for first year memberships, juniors, honorary memberships and the 21-35 age group category". The full playing member subscription will now be \$590 (incl. GST).

- **Remit:** After energetic discussion, the following remit was passed at the AGM:

"That the wearing of hats in the clubhouse is not allowed"

For those who did not attend the AGM, my 2022 Annual Report is attached for information, and is also available on the Club's website. As well as the club's 5-point plan for the future at the end of the newsletter.
