PRO TIP - back to basics

The Pitching Wedge is the most flexible club in your golf bag. As I mentioned in Pro – Tip 8 you can use it from 1 metre up to over 100 metres according to the individual. The power is not essential accuracy is!!! Everyone has basically 4 Gears. 1 - 2 - 3 - 4

4th gear is your normal full backswing (head high approx.) same F/through

3rd gear would be a ³/₄ backswing (shoulder high approx.) same F/through

2nd gear only ¹/₂ a backswing (waist high approx.) same F/through

1st gear just a short backswing (leg high approx.) same F/through


Having the same length of backswing as the follow through helps you with your BALANCE!!! Hit 20 balls & learn one gear at a time, then you will begin to control that **Pitching Wedge.**

RULES FOR TODAY'S 3 PERSON AMBROSE

- 1. Enjoy your day
- 2. Ambrose with a twist.

Your first hole of the day = all 3 tee off. Select the shot you wish to play your second from. Everyone continues as per normal Ambrose until ball holed. Your second hole – the persons tee shot used off the first hole sits out – so now you choose from 2 tee shots. Continue as for normal Ambrose with all 3 players playing out until holed out. Your third hole both shots used off previous 2 holes sit out, leaving the last team member to be used off the tee. This format is used in the next consecutive 3 holes and so on for 6 times. So, everyone uses 6 tee shots – 1 every 3 holes.

- Longest drive 18th hole <u>divisions</u> men's -and ladies. All able to play tee shots for longest drive. But eligible tee shot/s still to be used to complete hole.
- Hole in one <u>hole</u> and closest to pin 7th hole. One division. Again, all able to play tee shot for prize – but again eligible tee shot/s to be used to complete hole.
- 5. Lowest nett score wins day. Course handicaps off white tees for men and yellow ladies. Handicaps added together and divided by 5
- Cards to be swapped and marked by other playing team. Marking tee shot used as on card.
- Enjoy your day by challenging the other team for a beer on a hole by hole match.
- Maximum on course HCP WILL BE 36 so you can still play if over 36 but this will be the max for the competition
- 9. ALL players must be affiliated to a club.
- 10. PLEASE BE AT CLUB HOUSE AROUND 9 AM SO WE CAN SORT CARDS AND TEES THANKS.
