PRO TIP - back to basics

To go **PAST the HOLE** is possibly the most logical shot to play but how incredibly difficult to do consistently. WHY??? Pressure & lack of the correct Practice Routine!!! To go past the pin on the approach shots is to know your distances with each club. Most of you see the shot as the best shot that you can hit & then not hitting it 100%. you fall short!!! So, know your distances & then take 1 more!!!

On your chipping & putting, my old boss used to say **"if you don't go past the hole when you are practising, you'll never go past the hole under pressure !!"** Another big tip!!
