Golfing Tips

CHIPPING is like putting the better you are, the lower your scores.

- a) Visualize the first bounce of the ball is onto the green. *(There are exceptions to this.)*
- b) You can choose an 8 Iron – a running shot
- c) Or a pitching wedge – a little more height & less roll
- d) A sand wedge or lob wedge – a lot of height & very little roll

Stance/Posture.

- e) Very narrow stance & toes level *(square)*
- f) Ball middle
- g) Hands forward opposite the front leg
- h) Always hit down NEVER UP !!!


