Golf Trivia Question

There has been a question raised around the wall on the 5th hole and what relief players are entitled to.

The wall itself is man-made; therefore, it is classed as an immovable obstruction. Relief is available from the wall under rule 16.1a

16.1a

When Relief Is Allowed

(1) Meaning of Interference by Abnormal Course Condition.

Interference exists when any one of these is true:

- a. The player's ball touches or is in or on an abnormal course condition,*
- b. An abnormal course condition physically interferes with the player's area of intended stance or area of intended swing, or*
- c. Only when the ball is on the putting green, an abnormal course condition on or off the putting green intervenes on the line of play.*

When Relief is not allowed

- 1) a player's ball is in a penalty area
- 2) When playing the ball as it lies is clearly unreasonable because of something from which the player is not allowed to take free relief such as when a player is unable to make a stroke because of where the ball lies in a bush (I cover this next week)
- 3) When interference exists only because a player chooses a club, type of stance or swing or direction of play that clearly unreasonable under the circumstances.

The easiest way to know if you get free relief is to ask yourself,

If the obstruction wasn't there, could I hit the ball with a normal stroke.

If the answer is yes then you probably get free relief.

If the answer is no (because of a tree, bush or something that is not an immovable obstruction) then no free relief

Remember to always identify where your drop zone is BEFORE you touch the ball.

Once you touch your ball you must take the relief, otherwise if you replace the ball, you incur a one stroke penalty.

It is the NEAREST point of relief, not the BEST point, and its not always going to put you in a better position.

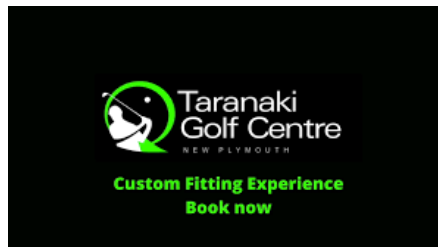
