Club President Report

Further to the newsletter of 8 September advising restrictions for playing golf as we moved down to Covid-19 Alert Level 2, unfortunately I have to report that Work-safe New Plymouth contacted us following receipt of a complaint that our Club was not meeting all the Level 2 clubhouse restrictions last Sunday 3 October.

I spoke with Work-safe New Plymouth's Senior Inspector yesterday to seek clarification.

His main point was that customer-facing/serving individuals, being our caterer and volunteer bar staff, are required by law under Level 2 either to wear masks (as we are seeing in cafe and restaurant businesses) or to put in place a suitable barrier screen, and the Club must enforce this. In addition social distancing of 2m within the clubhouse is to be promoted: we set up the circular tables some time ago for four persons only, and have today ensured that this arrangement remains in place.

The Work-safe inspector and I discussed the various other measures the Club has put in place over the last 18 months in line with Golf NZ's Covid-19 advisories, including the on-course constraints, our Covid-19 Safety Plan, the QR contact tracing code, and the sign-in contact register for those without smartphones. The Work-safe inspector indicated his general satisfaction with our efforts.

I ask all members to please comply with the above (and other Level 2 restrictions outlined previously) as we obviously would not want our golf course or clubhouse to be closed down for the remaining duration of Alert Level 2 in Taranaki. Also, if anyone has any concerns with the Club's management of Alert Level 2 restrictions, it would be appreciated if they would contact me in the first instance to discuss.


