Re Committee Meeting 15 March

Main points are summarised as follows:

- **Health & Safety:** Discussion re initial impressions of new red/green traffic light system operating for safe play on the 3rd and 4th holes: working well, and although waiting times on the 3rd tee have increased with a full field, waiting to tee off on the 5th tee has more or less been eliminated.
- **Match Committee:** Matchplay club champs to commence on 20 March – organisational aspects to be reviewed for improvements next year.
- **Greymouth Petroleum Seismic Survey:** Initial surveying activities to peg shothole locations on our course are scheduled for tomorrow Thursday 25 March (noting access is restricted to Mondays and Thursdays only).
- **Possible New Bunkers:** The committee discussed a letter received from Rob Fraser expressing concern about the possible addition of fairway bunkers on the 12th and 18th holes and pot bunkers in front of the 18th green. The proposed bunker locations have been marked out and represented by unmown grass to give players a visual idea of what they might look like. It was decided that a note outlining the fairway bunker strategy (with regard to course rating) will be developed and posted on the clubhouse noticeboard along with Rob's letter to facilitate further member feedback. However as noted previously, this proposal still "lies on the table" at this stage.

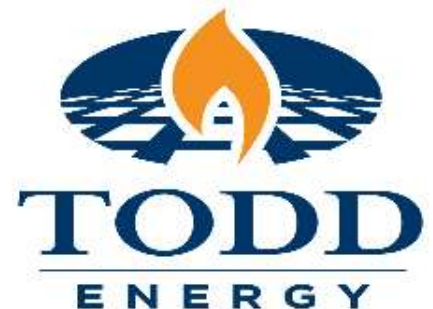

Golf Course Safety Guidelines

Further to the previous newsletter article re the traffic light system instituted recently at the 3rd and 4th tees for safety reasons, please note the following basic points to minimise the risk of anyone getting hit by a golf ball anywhere on the course.

Our course staff will generally endeavour to get their work done on the greens, especially on competition days, before play starts, but this will not always be possible. If they are approaching a green to do some work and there are players either on that tee or on that fairway, the course staff will stand aside and wait, or move to another green. The same applies to work on fairways or bunkers.

However, if course staff have started a relatively brief job on a green, such as mowing, then players should wait to hit up until that task has been completed and the green cleared, and only hit up earlier if waved to do so by the course staff.

The general principle on most golf courses is **“Give way to course staff at all times”**, and to this end we are planning to increase the visibility of the current sign at the 1st tee and possibly install further signs at the 7th and 13th tees.

The same principle also applies when following other golfers: If in doubt re distance, do not hit up.
