PRO TIP - back to basics

THE PITCHING WEDGE is the most flexible club in the bag as it could be used from 1 metre off the green up to 120 metres according to your own power. Chipping is from about 30 metres & then your shots become pitches. 30 metres, 40 metres, 50 metres & upwards has to be learnt & the way to do that is to play 20 balls to an umbrella stuck into the ground. The shorter the shot the shorter the swing e.g. full swing 4^{th} gear - $\frac{1}{2}$ swing = 2^{nd} gear & whatever the distance you achieve is your own power.
