Recent Committee Meetings

Mostly routine monthly business matters, correspondence, reports and discussions on various projects:

- Government Business Support Payments: The Club has applied for and received several wage subsidy and business resurgence support payments due to loss of income experienced during the restrictions under various Covid-19 Alert levels.
- *Tee Time Booking System:* Possible options are being investigated to allow remote online booking of tee times for Club days in particular.
- *Coring and Sanding of Greens:* Members will be aware by now of the huge effort put in by our Course Superintendent and keen band of volunteers in the massive recent working bee operation to core and sand the greens many thanks to all who assisted (*see also Course Superintendent report*).
- Water Storage Reservoir: With the greens coring project postponed a day because of poor weather on the morning it was due to start, the opportunity was taken to utilise the volunteer workforce to carry out the challenging task of draining and cleaning out our water storage reservoir.
- Carpark Upgrade & Sealing: A further onsite meeting with contractor Fulton Hogan was held recently to assist with their detailed planning work, with a target onsite works commencement date of Monday 29 November. Fulton Hogan will require up to two weeks to execute the weather-dependent project, during which car parking arrangements will be a challenge for the Club. However some of the grassed areas not being sealed are expected to remain accessible for parking. Meanwhile three of the Club's volunteers commenced early site works yesterday by removing several trees to facilitate the planned new expansive carpark layout.
- *Upgraded Hole Signage:* This project is near complete after many hours of volunteer work, with only installation of infill end pavers outstanding.
- *Sprinklers:* Replacement of all sprinkler heads around greens with more efficient units is progressing, with the dual aims of reduced water use and reduced maintenance.
- *Deck Sail:* Our Ladies and Men are working together to install a sail over the clubhouse deck area, using their respective Pennants competition team reward funds.
- *Upgrade of Amenities Block:* Resources permitting ,work is expected to start by end November.

We are looking for about 4 people to help run the twilight nights,


starting from 3-3 30pm to take entry's, money and make up teams to play as they arrive.






Golfing Tips

The Dreaded SLICE !!!




Everyone slices the ball at some stage in your golfing life, the secret is to control it. The practice area is where you learn to do this. Firstly understand WHY you slice!!

- The club face is coming across the ball, teachers call it the out-to-in swing path.
- The fault is using too much effort from the "little body" at the start of the downswing & the head + the body gets in front of the ball.
- Also realize that if the body is moving faster through impact than the right hand the club face will usually be open.
- The feeling should be that your hands square up the club face going PAST "little body" not the other way round. Sit in a chair & imagine holding a club, turn to your right as though making a backswing, now swing to the left. There you have just seen the hands go over & past your body!!
- Take the effort out of your body & get that right hand PAST A STEADY HEAD !!! 5.
- Reverse this instruction for you Lefties.
